In this anniversary year, our hearts can treasure the gifts of generations of disciples who served, built, taught, prayed and shared the Gospel, all in their worship of Jesus. We enjoy a 150 year old sanctuary with its basement classrooms that still serves for worship, learning and helping the poor today. In 1875, on the day the \$21,000 Sanctuary was dedicated to God's glory, the congregation raised \$9,000 to pay off what remained of the cost of the building. In the 1950's the congregation expanded the building for Christian Education, so that every child, youth and adult could learn about the love of God. Yet the building didn't meet that need – it was Christians full of hope and devotion, being a blessing.

As we celebrate the past, join us in working towards God's Future:

 - Repaired the brick work.
 - Replaced the heating controls
 - Repaired the parking lot
 - Made repairs to the Christian Education roof, avoiding an expensive replacement
- ❖ With the money previous generations have left to our reserve funds, we have been able to keep the building well maintained. Over the next years we expect to:
 - Upgrade our outside sign to a digital display
 - Bring our fire detection systems up to date.
 - Continue to replace windows around the church to improve our security and reduce heating costs
 - Improve accessibility with an internal ramp.
